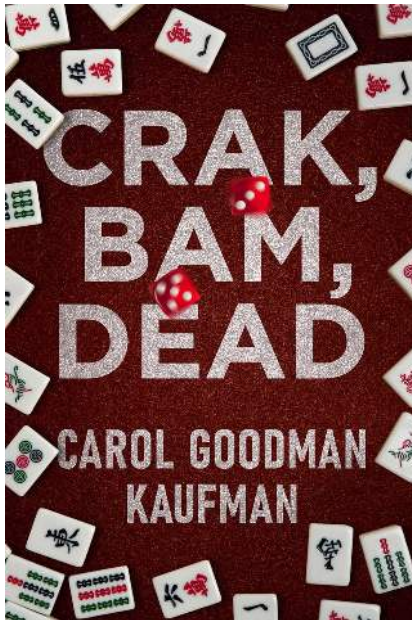
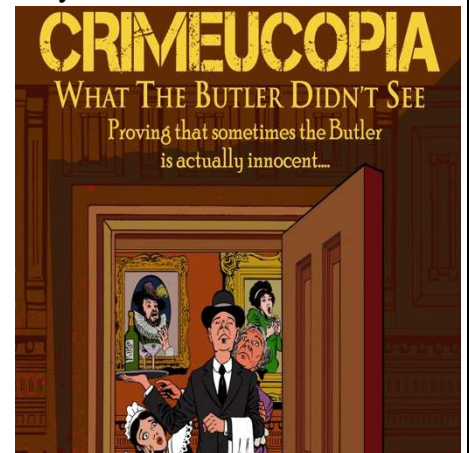


Murder We Write

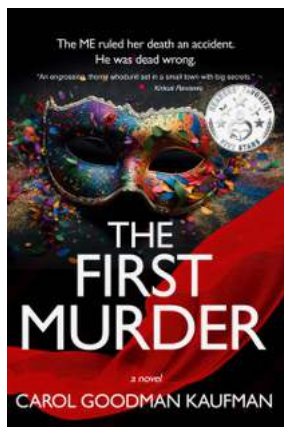
